Classroom Catch Up: What a fantastic first week we've had in Class R/1! We are incredibly proud of the Reception children who have settled into school life brilliantly. It has been lovely to watch their confidence grow each day. Year One have been excellent role models to Reception, demonstrating our school behaviour charter of being Ready, Respectful and Safe at all times. Reception have enjoyed meeting





and getting to know their 'Big Friend' in Year 6 who will act as their buddy. We have had an exciting week taking part in Forest School, music, drama and so much more! A highlight of the week was the children



exploring robots in computing. We hope you have a restful weekend and we look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Monday.

What a wonderful first week we have had in Y2/3 and everyone has settled in so well, including Mrs Wells. We are mastering our new rou-



tines nicely and we have the added responsibility of looking after our own pencil case and keeping our own drawer very tidy and organised. Our maths focus this week has been revision of our number bonds to ten, which are so important as we move up the school. We have also been looking at fact families in maths and some of us have started to use the term 'inverse operation!' In our English lessons we have been embedding our reading skills with revision of the valuable skills of skimming and scanning, retrieval and reading aloud with intonation and tone. As this first week was our 'Art' week, we have enjoyed designing our own printing blocks and creating repeated patterns with a rotational element. We have also looked at a lovely artist called Martha Zausmer and used her ideas to inspire our own collagraphy printing blocks.

It has been full steam ahead this week in Class 4/5! In English we have started our new text 'Street Child' which is set in Victorian London. We have been focusing on the VIPERS (our reading skills) linked with the text and the children have provided some very well thought out ideas. In maths, we are all focusing on place value and the children have blown me away with their prior knowledge. As it has been art week in school, we have spent our afternoons drawing and sketching facial parts ahead of producing our own portraits in the style of Pablo Picasso. It has been lovely to welcome back the Year 5s and also get to know the Year 4s – I think we are going to have a fabulous year! As expected, Year 6 have come back and hit the ground running. In maths, we have gone straight into place value, looking at numbers up to 10,000,000. For English, we have started our first topic of the year 'Greek Myths' which links perfectly to our first history topic, 'The Ancient Greeks'! To introduce our R.E. topic, we have made links between our school Mission Statement and the life of Jesus.

Read through the information below, which explains more about Torbjørn's journey.

Visiting all 203 countries of the world without flying!

In early 2013, Torbjørn Pedersen, a hopeful adventurer from Denmark, received an email that changed his life.

'My father sent me a link to an article, and I clicked on it. I quickly realised that no one in history had gone to every single country in the world without flying. The fact caught my interest and stuck with me.'

Torbjørn was already fascinated with world firsts: the first to go to the North Pole, the South Pole, the deepest sea, the highest mountain, the longest river. Now he believed he had a chance to set a world record himself. 'It was right in front of me. I could do something of significance with my life, something worth putting in a book, something worth remembering. And it would be a great adventure!'

Torbjørn decided to be the first person to visit all 203 countries without flying or any breaks. He had just two rules for his challenge:

- 1. Spend at least 24 hours in each country.
- 2. Not return home until he finished.

4 Torbjørn did his best to keep costs low and lived off a budget of roughly \$20 (£16) a day.



Throughout his journey, Torbjørn faced many difficulties, including spending two years instead of four days in Hong Kong, during the coronavirus pandemic that began in 2020, and being unable to support friends during difficult times back home.

He also had some incredible experiences including asking his girlfriend, who was visiting, to marry him during a snowstorm on top of Mount Kenyal

Torbjørn's journey came to an end on 23rd May 2023, when the 44-year-old arrived in the Maldives, the final country on his list of 203!


