Mindfulness Matters:

A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step **Classroom Catch Up:** We have had a lovely week this week in Class R/1! We had an exciting moving up morning on Wednesday which the children loved! Miss Ollerton and Mrs Wells said how beautifully behaved the children were and we are so unbelievably proud of them all! We have been looking at more living things in science; we have been finding trees, bushes, plants, flowers and vegetables in Forest School and around our school grounds. In English, we have been loving our new story, 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' - looking at new vocabulary and discussing our thoughts and feelings about the text. Coach Andy from the South Ribble Sports Partnership was also in school this week to teach tennis skills to Class R/1—and every class in school!

We have had another buys week in Class 2/3! Maths wise, Year 3 have been converting, adding and subtracting money, whilst Year 2 have explored tally charts as part of their statistics topic. In English we are reading "Hansel and Gretel". The children are enjoying exploring the characters and plot patterns. They are looking forward to planning and writing their own traditional

tales with a twist! In PSHE, we have explored ways in which we can stay safe in our community with a focus on water safety.

The children in Class 4/5 have started to plan their own chapter of "The Indian in the Cupboard" this week with the title 'Cowboy!' and I am therefore very much looking forward to seeing what they produce next week. In science, the children have now looked at all the stages of the human life cycle and have showcased their knowledge of this unit by producing their own piece of writing explaining the changes we go through as humans during our life. In maths, Year 4 have started the unit of money whereas year 5 have been calculating missing lengths and angles inside shapes. And of course, on Wednesday we had transition morning where the children enjoyed spending time with their new class (Year 4) and new teacher (Year 5).

It's been very quiet this week in Class 6. There have been a lot of high school taster sessions on, and the class has been mostly empty for the majority of the week. What little time we have had, has been jam packed though! Our end of year production is approaching fast, and we are soldiering on, learning lines, trying on costumes, singing and dancing - it's going to be fantastic!



WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

A video-sharing platform designed as an alternative to YouTube, Rumble is the epitome of a 'slow burner' in digital circles: it was initially launched in 2013, but it's only in the last two or three years that it's begun to gain serious traction. Much of Rumble's recent growth has stemmed from its association with Truth Social, the platform founded by former US President Donald Trump. Rumble's content frequently reflects some intense political viewpoints; this can often affect the way it approaches topics and has occasionally caused the platform to venture into controversial territory.

TALK ABOUT POLITICS

Rumble does have a team of moderators, but the nature of the platform means that some permitted content is likely to be controversial and highly subjective. That possibility might make many parents uncomfortable – but if your child *does* view (or hear about) something provocative on Rumble, it can still provide a useful opportunity to discuss politics at home in a safe, relaxed environment 97

CHECK UP REGULARLY

Like any video-sharing platform, there's a chance that Rumble might suggest inappropriate content for your child. There may be an algorithm issue – or it could be that the recommendations are based on videos they've previously viewed. If your child uses Rumble, you might consider a chat with them about which accounts they follow and what type of content is suitable for their age.

RESEARCH ALTERNATIVES

No video-sharing platform is totally free from potentially harmful content, of course – but the number of prominent account holders on Rumble whose output has previously been banned from similar services is certainly a cause for concern. If your child is becoming interested in influencer culture or politics specifically, you could perhaps research more family-friendly platforms together.

TRENDING

DISCUSS IMPARTIALITY

Many prominent Rumble accounts wear their political leanings firmly on their sleeves. As a result, it can be tricky for impressionable young people to appreciate both sides of any given debate. If your child is old enough to use Rumble, you may feel that a discussion of some things they've seen might be prudent – if so, be prepared from some complex (and possibly lengthy) conversations!
