city- a city is larger than a town - usually with a population of over 100,000 people.	time zones- because the time is different depending on where you are in the world, everyone has agreed to split the world up into time zones.	tourism- is when people travel from where they live to another place for pleasure or relaxation.	geographics- means the geography of an area e.g. land, location, people or physical features such as mountains.
capital city- is a city or town where the central government of a country is.	region- a region is a specific area that has common features.	landmark- are features or structures around the world that are easily recognised or unique. They can be natural or man-made.	UK - is short for United Kingdom and includes England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
