Through pupil questionnaires, 100% of our children have stated they feel safe in school. St Joseph's has a bronze UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools Award and are working towards silver. Children are taught, in a child friendly way, how to keep safe both in and out of school and on-line. School has child-friendly policies for Behaviour, On-line Safety and Safeguarding. School rules are shared and agreed in each class. The Behaviour Policy is shared with parents and pupils and adhered to. St Joseph's follows the KidSafe Programme as part of PSHE lessons. St Joseph's curriculum, learning and teaching ensures high expectations for all.

#### I am aware of the Catholic values that the school teaches

The school website provides a wealth of information regarding St Joseph's ethos, values and mission. Our Catholic values underpin everything we do and is evident in practice in our shared prayer and liturgy sessions and demonstrated through our actions and behaviour. Families are invited to share Mass and Prayer and Liturgy sessions.

The school newsletter is produced weekly. This contains a "Classroom Round-up" section highlighting the work your child has been learning that week. On our school website, under "Curriculum" is a wealth of information going into greater detail about the areas of study for each subject, for your child, over the course of the year. These areas cover not only work, but useful websites and helpful tips for parents to support their learning at home. Under the class pages on the website you will find specific overviews for each class, their areas of learning and topics being covered. We always start the year with a "Meet the Teacher" session which showcases the timetable and work being taught in each class over the year. This gives parents the opportunity to see how their child has settled into the new school year and ask any questions. In the second half of the autumn term we have a parents' appointment to discuss how your child is progressing. Teachers produce an interim report, conduct a further parents' evening later in the year and each pupil receives an end-of-year report. Class assemblies are an opportunity for children to showcase their learning to families. Parents are welcome to make an appointment with their class teacher at any time in the academic year should they have any worry or concern.

#### I am made to feel welcome when visiting school

School/home partnership is vital in ensuring children achieve their best. Assemblies; Prayer and Liturgy sessions, Stay and Play, school performances; Masses, PTFA events are all examples of how we share and celebrate our learning. Many of our school volunteers are members of our St Joseph's family community.

#### As a parent/carer, school supports our family's needs School seeks the views of parents / carers and takes account of their suggestions or concerns

School has sent out a number of questionnaires recently. For example, communication; after-school clubs' information; school's Behaviour Policy; Data Collection and consent to share information; On-Line safety plus the current questionnaire. Staff, especially SLT, spend a great deal of time taking any worries or concerns seriously. The vast majority of our parents feel school goes above and beyond in supporting concerns and needs. Miss Dewhurst always finds time to talk through worries with parents in order to find a solution. We pride ourselves with our open-door policy. Please continue to make an appointment should you feel you need help with anything relating to your child and family.

# If your child has special educational or additional needs, do you feel school gives your child appropriate support?

The Headteacher, Miss Dewhurst is also the SENDCo. As a school, we buy into two separate SEN companies. One to give additional, tailored assessments to understand in more detail the barriers children have to learning. The other company provides expertise to staff on areas to support additional needs within the classroom. Staff access a wide range of support, and staff meetings and INSET time is also used to increase expertise in SEN.
