The Dedication of Liverpool Cathedral of Christ the King

The Cathedral reminds us that the little parish or community of faith here at St Joseph's is part of the larger community of parishes that make up the (arch) diocese of Liverpool where resides the Bishop who rules from his *Cathedra* (chair/throne) uniting us all as one community of faith.

The building itself is obviously a place for gathering for prayer and praise of God as all churches are. But, built of stones bonded by cement, it is also an outward sign of its members themselves living stones and bonded in the love of Christ...the King.
