Readings: Acts 14:21-27, Revelation 21:1-5, John 13:31-35.

Our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles finds Saints Paul and Barnabus encouraging the disciples to continue in the faith and that it is through many tribulations that we must enter the Kingdom of God.

Sometimes, we read in these accounts of the first century church that all was calm, with the new converts remaining faithful to the teachings of the apostles, united in heart and soul to the brotherhood and the breaking of bread and to praying as a community sharing everything in common.

But there were also persecutions by people who just wanted to *close down* this new Christian movement – St Stephen being one of the first to be *closed down*.

There were also splits/divisions among this new community on matters of faith; of who is in or out with regard to the convert Jews and Gentiles, and of how one should live one's life as a Christian among other issues.

In the face of all of this, holding on to the faith must have been difficult for so many and it is to these that the saints offer *encouragement* to *persevere*.

St John too, is offering a vision of *encouragement* in his book of *Revelation* (2nd reading) of a new heaven and earth where all the tears of suffering will be wiped away by the God who loves them as a husband his bride.

The thing is, that from those earliest times, the people of God (people like you and me) have had to undergo lots of suffering and change, and through the tears and pain, they may lose sight of the only one who can help them – the God who has always been among them in his blessed Son Jesus, who walks with them and leads them towards the new and heavenly Jerusalem.

The numerous Saints are also with us on this journey and with their prayers, they continue as co-workers in Christ in the bringing about of this new creation and they intercede on our behalf, to persevere in faith come what may.

So let us always turn to them for *encouragement*, perhaps especially to *St Barnabus* whose name means *Son* of *Encouragement*, *Son of Consolation*.
